Centenary Year

Following on from our Centenary Big Lunch Celebration in June, which was such a wonderful day, various things have happened to mark the occasion.

- History booklets celebrating the history of the park continue to sell well and can be bought from us or from Oldfield Rd post office, price £2. There is more history to discover on our website, including recorded interviews.
- We have printed a limited edition of 15 hardbacked photobooks to commemorate the day. These are for sale at £25.
- Perennials have been planted in the ornamental garden.
- The Black Mulberry Tree, planted by two of the grandchildren of Sir John Leigh on 4th June, continues to flourish. The Leigh family have become Life Members of the Friends group, and remain interested in the care and upkeep of the park.
- New sets of greetings cards have been printed - packs of 6 different beautiful views of the park, blank inside for your own message, £3 per pack
- A new 2018 calendar is coming, made up of photographs taken and sent to us by visitors who love the park.
- The Friends group has planted perennials on the Manchester Rd corner, with funding from a Thrive Trafford Community Grant.
- We are looking into installing two Interpretation panels showing a map and the history of the park to be sited near the octagonal bed.
- We are delighted that the park has again been awarded Green Flag status for 2017-2018.
- We are pleased to be part of Altrincham's presentation to The RHS North West in Bloom, and the national Britain In Bloom projects.



Park Updates

Keeping The Park Safe and Tidy

We know that we are fortunate to have such a lovely park – the lie of the land, the inheritance of trees from the Oldfield Estate and the thoughtful design and layout of play areas and sport facilities, give us a strong base. Happily most people who come to the park treat it with great respect. We have not felt the need to organise 'litter picks' because little litter is dropped, even after busy events. What there is is picked up and tidied away there and then. Considering the use of the park by dogs and dog walkers, 'pooh' is rarely the problem we hear of in other parks – but this requires care and discipline at all times.

We are very pleased that many young people enjoy being on the park – sometimes as part of a school activity, but very often at weekends, evenings and holidays. Most go about their business with respect for the park and its facilities and for other people. But from time to time we have felt threatened by gatherings of a dozen or more who raise noise and behave in ways which flout the rules of good behaviour and mutual respect. When this happens, the worry is that bad will lead on to worse and that more damage and insult will result.

The lack of 'resident' employed staff on this and other parks means that responsibility falls on other park users. We do not want to encourage a culture of vigilantes. It is important that situations are recognised and defused with calm as far as possible, but the situation is worrying and something we feel 'the authorities' should be resourced to act on.

This summer it has become apparent that neither Trafford MBC nor Amey can help with these matters during regular days nor out of hours. More worrying still is to find that the police are often unobtainable unless situations have escalated to crisis and justify a 999 call. We do not believe this to be an acceptable situation.




